Reflection is something I love capturing and this one was captured on a lovely evening at Bakkatjörn pond in Seltjarnarnes, an Icelandic township located within the Greater Reykjavík area.



The midnight sun

We have had an amazing midnight sun with stunning colors here in Reykjavik over this summer. This shot is captured at around 02:00 AM at Grandabót seashore close to my home.





Seashore

We have some stunning seashores here in Iceland and this one is behind the oil tanks at Grandahólmi. Here I was able to capture the rough Atlantic ocean and the beautiful mount Esja in the background on a rather chilly evening in Reykjavik.



Seascape

Beautiful seascape is always nice to capture. Here is a painting styled seascape in Seltjarnarnes an Icelandic township located within the Greater Reykjavík area.



Mountains

Iceland is full of mountains and we have many mountains hovering over the Reykjavik capital area. This picture shows Mt. Akrafjall covered with snow seen from Grótta in Seltjarnarnes an Icelandic township located within the Greater Reykjavík area.



At winters the pond (Tjörnin) in downtown Reykjavik is often frozen for months allowing people to walk on it without the risk of breaking the ice. A great place to visit and photograph.

Gunnar Árnason (1931-1989). Sun Voyager is a dreamboat, an ode to the sun.
Intrinsically, it contains within itself the
promise of undiscovered territory,
a dream of hope, progress and freedom.
The sculpture is located by Sæbraut, by
the sea in the centre of Reykjavík,
Iceland



Streets in Reykjavik

Granaskjol street is a peaceful neighborhood street located in the western part of Reykjavik. I was lucky to capture this part of the street without any cars, not often a moment like that comes along. This is the street where I grew up and lived most of my life. My parents still live here and my home is close-by so I visit this lovely street almost daily.



Old Farms in Iceland

Hof á Höfðaströnd is a farm where my grandmother grew up. The farm is close to the village of Hofsos and the house has been renovated and looks perfect in the Skagafjordur landscape in the northwestern part of Iceland.



Ships and harbors

Fishing vessels being repaired at Slippurinn shipyard at the old harbor in downtown Reykjavik. The old harbor was built between the years 1913 and 1917. Apart from it being a beautiful place to walk with stunning views across the bay to Mount Esja, the Old Harbor area is where the majority of marine activities in Reykjavik, such as whale watching and puffin tours are concentrated.



Lighthouses around Iceland

There are many lighthouses around Iceland and one of my favorite is lighthouse at Grótta. The first lighthouse in Grótta was built in 1897 and the current one dates back to 1947. The original lens is still in use and the lighthouse was electrified in 1956.

Grótta is a spit of land in Seltjarnarnes, a neighboring town of Reykjavík, which turns into an island at high tide. During low tide one can reach Grótta on foot and stay there for approximately six hours before the isthmus is flooded.



Bakkatjörn in Seltjarnarnes

Bakkatjorn pond in Seltjarnarnes is a particularly beautiful natural reserves and rich with birdlife. I often go there to capture the scene around the pond.



Ægissíða shore

Ægissíða seashore is located close to my home in the western part of Iceland's capital city. I often go there to relax and do some photographing and on the evening this photo was shot we had an amazing light show in the sky with these strange pink/orange clouds hovering over the shore



Öskjuhlíð outdoor area in Reykjavik

Öskjuhlíð is a hill in the center of Reykjavík. It is 61 meters (200 ft) above sea level and is a designated outdoors area that is covered with trees. An interesting place to visit and photograph.



Road shots

Road shot taken on my photo tour in South Iceland in January of this year. On that day we had snowy roads, so it was very nice to have a jeep that could get us easily between places.



Untouched snow

Mountain View from the south coast of Iceland. The weather when this shot was taken was very nice, almost clear sky, no wind but it was cold around -10°C. Personally I think the footsteps on the picture are quite interesting and the untouched snow all the way towards the mountains.



Cold winter shots

Here is a picture of small Cottages at Landbrot near Kirkjubæjarklaustur on the south coast of Iceland. When this shot was taken it was -13°C Outside but no wind and clear sky. Perfect atmosphere to capture the cold winter scene.



Northern Lights

It is always very enjoyable to capture the Northern Lights. This shot was captured around midnight at the seashore next to the island of Grótta . It is probably one of the best spot to capture them here in the western part of Reykjavik, with no light pollution from the streets lights; you can enjoy them in darkness.



Unadalur Valley in the northwestern part of Iceland

On this picture you can see a pathway through the snowy Unadalur Valley in the northwestern part of Iceland. The valley is situated on the eastern Skagafjördur in the northwestern part of Iceland and lies to the east from the village of Hofsos.



Headland of Thordarhofdi (seen from my parent's summerhouse)

My parent's summerhouse in Skagafjörður close to the village of Hofsos, located in the northwestern part of Iceland. This shot is taken at midnight and has the headland of Thordarhofdi in the background. Þórðarhöfði Cape (Thordarhofdi) is a headland in Skagafjörður that is joined to land



Old churches around Iceland

There are many old wooden churches in Iceland dated back to the 18 and 19 century. This photo shows the church at Hofsós which was consecrated on the 28th of August 1960 and can seat 164 people. The architect Sveinn Kjarval drew the chandelier/lighting. The beautiful baptismal font in the church was carved from basalt columns taken from basalt formations at Staðarbjargvík at Hofsós.



Icelandic horses

On one of my trips to Skagafjörður I managed to capture this moment with the Icelandic horses and the Unadalur valley in the background. These horses are next to my parent's summerhouses in the northwestern part of Iceland and when I went to take photos of them they either decided to play some games on me or rest in front of me.

It is interesting to watch these horses from the summerhouse terrace few meters away, they are all stallions breed by my niece and seems to have different personalities and are very energetic.



The village of Hofsos

Hofsós in northwest Iceland is one of the oldest trading ports in northern Iceland dating back to the 16th century. The economy has been based mainly on the fishing industry as well as services to the neighboring farms. This was largely due to its natural harbor. In recent years Hofsós with a population of about 200 individuals has built itself up as a tourist attraction and has The Icelandic Emigration Center (Vesturfarasetrið á Hofsósi), dedicated to the westward migration to North America of Icelanders that reached its peak at the start of the 19th century.



Dark clouds

I really enjoy capturing pictures of dark and moody clouds. This one was hovering over the sea near the town of Seltjarnarnes an Icelandic township located within the Greater Reykjavík area.

The Atlantic Ocean surrounds the town on almost every side except the east which faces towards the city of Reykavik. Seltjarnarnes is on the tip of a peninsula and is flanked by a beautiful desolate



Sun clouds

I always look for sun clouds and when the sun is trying to break through the clouds, it so often gives you interesting moments to capture. In this shot I captured the sun hovering behind the clouds at Seltjarnanes giving the scenery a warm feeling to it.



Graveyards at night

It is something being inside a graveyard at nights and so many interesting subjects with light and darkness to capture. Here I was at Hólavallagarður cemetery which is situated in the western part of Reykjavík at Suðurgata. The cemetery was consecrated in 1838 and its 'guardian' is Guðrún Oddsdóttir.

There are many intriguing tombstones in the cemetery and there is a specially made square with samples of old gravestones to be found here. Memorial plots for French and Faeroese sailors are to be found in this ancient cemetery.









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
